3. By-Laws <u>Membership Fee</u> The membership fee shall be paid to the Association and shall be \$20.00 per member per year or \$50.00 for three years. This fee may be adjusted by a majority vote at a duly called Annual Meeting.	3. By-Laws Membership Fee The membership fee shall be paid to the Association and shall be \$50.00 per member per year or \$120.00 for three years. This fee may be adjusted by a majority vote at a duly called Annual Meeting. Effective for membership renewals for 2023 and beyond.
 4. Annual Special and Directors' Meetings The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held prior to January 15th each year, at such time and place as decided by the Board of Directors. 	
 Notice of the Annual or Special Meeting shall be mailed to members in writing at least ten days prior to the date of the meeting. 	 Notice of the Annual or Special Meeting shall be communicated to members in writing at least ten days prior to the date of the meeting.

The Annual Meeting shall be presided over by The Annual Meeting shall be presided over by the President or in his absence, the Vicethe President or in their absence, the Vice-President, or in his absence, someone President, or in their absence, someone appointed by the President. appointed by the President. The program of the Annual Meeting shall include: minutes of the previous Annual Meeting, auditor's report and financial statement, report of the year's activities, election of Directors, and appointment of auditors for the coming year. For Annual or Special Meetings, a quorum For Annual or Special Meetings, a quorum shall be 20% of the membership. For Directors' shall be 20% of the membership. For Directors' Meetings a quorum shall be 30% of the Meetings a quorum shall be 50% of the Directorate. Directorate. 5. Executive The Executive of the Association shall be the Past President, President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, and 3rd Vice-President as elected by the general membership at the Annual Meeting. No person may hold the office for President for more than one consecutive year. President and Vice-President must be duly elected directors who have preferably completed two three-year terms. 6. Directors Directors shall be elected annually from the membership, to consist of at least one, to a maximum of three, Directors from each township. The maximum term of office for Directors shall be two three-year terms. Former Directors who have served their maximum term will be eligible for re-election following a one-year absence from the Directorate. necessary, a vote by show of hands or by	
secret ballot shall decide who is to fill the	
office and will be decided at the Annual	
Meeting.	
9. Vacancy of Office	
If a vacancy occurs from any cause in any	
office or on the Board of Directors of the	
Association, the Nominating Committee may	
appoint a member to complete the unexpired	
term of office.	
10. <u>Duties</u>	
Board of Directors – Having been duly elected, the	
Board of Directors shall be responsible for	
conducting all the affairs of the Association for	
the year. The Board of Directors shall form	
committees to manage Association activities as	
required.	
<u>Committee Chairman</u> – Shall provide a written	
report for the Annual Meeting.	
Past-President – The Past-President shall assist	
the President as needed, and may stand in as	
chair of meetings, and representative to the

Association.

Secretary-Treasurer – The Secretary-Treasurer shall be in charge of all books of the Association, sign cheques, and look after the correspondence of the Association and any other duties as directed by the Board of Directors. This will be a paid position at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
